Emergency Response Action Plan

for Guwahati, Nalbari, Nagaon, Silchar & Sivasagar

In pursuance to the Hon'ble NGT order dated 20.11.2019 in O.A no. 681/2018, PCBA has prepared an Emergency Response Action Plan for implementation under different Air Quality Index (AQI) categories namely, Moderate & Poor, Very Poor, and Severe as per National Air Quality Index, regarding air quality in Non-Attainment cities (NACs) of Assam.

When Air Quality Index crosses Satisfactory level (Index value >100), the ERS shall be implemented in the five non-attainment cities of Assam.

The Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change has notified the need for implementation of Graded Response Action Plan through Environment Pollution (Prevention & Control) Authority vides S.O. 118 (E) dated January 12, 2017.
